[Dr. Kevin Fenton] Program Collaboration and Service Integration is a mechanism for blending and organizing inter-related services and activities for the prevention and control of HIV, STD, TB, and viral hepatitis.

In other words, it's ensuring that we become more than the sum of the individual parts of our prevention activities in the national center. And it really speaks to ways in which we collaborate across infectious disease portfolios and the ways in which we ensure that, at the client level, that people who are trying to access services for any of our infectious diseases can obtain much more holistic and integrated and high-quality and evidence-based prevention interventions.

So, really, we're looking at moving away from individual and siloed approaches to much more holistic approaches for health.
